

ENGAGE

Have you ever stopped and asked, “Why church?” Depending on your background, church can be a big deal or perhaps not that big of a deal at all. After all, while some hardly think twice about attending church, millions of people, all over the world, arrange their schedule to make it a priority. There are countless reasons that people may give for not being interested in church, but have you ever considered what the people who love church have discovered? Wherever you are on the spectrum of church excitement, this session is designed to explain why we at Mission Church love the Church.

People regularly comment on how fired up and focused the people are at Mission Church. But again, the question is why?

- 1 Why do you think the people of Mission Church are so excited?
- 2 What excites you about coming to church?

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EXPLORE

The primary reason we are fired up for church is because Jesus loves His Church. After all, it was His idea. As a matter of fact, the Church belongs to Him. He created it and gave it its purpose. Check out the following verses to see for yourself what the Bible has to say about the Church. The first point is very simple yet profound.

Jesus Created the Church. It was His Idea.

MATTHEW 16:13-18

¹³ Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” ¹⁴ And they said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” ¹⁵ He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” ¹⁶ Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” ¹⁷ And Jesus answered him, “Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

When you read Mathew 16, it appears obvious that Peter's answer to Jesus' question was a big deal. As a matter of fact, Jesus took Peter's answer and said, "Upon this rock I will build *my* Church." Jesus' question is a great one for all of us to answer.

1 Who do you say Jesus is? How would you define and / or describe Him?

Jesus was saying His Church would be built on the truth that He is the Messiah (Savior). In other words, the gospel message is the foundation of the Church.

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2 Have you ever heard the gospel explained?

3 If yes, try to put it in your own words.

(If you need help, check out 1 Corinthians 15:1-4)

Jesus said not only that He would build His Church but also that the gates of hell would not prevail against it. It's important to note that gates are a defensive structure meant to stop others. So the implication in Jesus' statement is that the Church is a powerful force empowered by God. The Church is taking ground. It is on mission! This leads us to our second point.

4 Before we move to our second point, what would you say is the mission of the Church?

Jesus Commissioned His Church. It Exists for Him.

MATTHEW 28:18-20

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

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Jesus said these words to His disciples after He died for our sins and rose from the grave and shortly before He ascended into heaven. Imagine being there with Jesus when He said, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.”

5 What is the significance of Jesus having all authority?

6 What does it mean for our individual lives and our church?

What Jesus says in verse 19 is called the Great Commission. It's the mission of our church and should be for every other church that ever has and will ever exist. The mission of Jesus' Church is to make disciples.

7 From what you've read, experienced, or observed, how would you define or describe a disciple?

Jesus calls us all to become disciples and then to participate in making more disciples. He specifies three things that must be done to do so.

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- Go (*Evangelize*)
- Baptize (*Establish*)
- Teach to Observe all He Comanded (*Equip*)



8 As a disciple, where are you in this process?

9 As someone called to participate in making disciples, how equipped do you feel?

The rest of this booklet is designed to better equip you to be on mission at Mission Church. But before we conclude this session, there is one more important point we must examine.

Jesus Calls His Church to Grow. It Glorifies Him.

ACTS 14:21-23

²¹ When they had preached the gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, ²² strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God. ²³ And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed.

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When you read the above passage with the mission in mind, you notice all the elements that Jesus mentioned in Matthew 28. The Apostle Paul preached the gospel and made many disciples. He no doubt baptized them and then strengthened their souls through the teaching of Jesus. Finally, it says he appointed elders over all the churches. Do you see it? Paul was transforming communities by making disciples and planting churches. Simply put, he was fulfilling Jesus' mission.

10 Have you ever thought of church-planting as part of Jesus' mission?

Wow! I love this passage. This verse is one of the reasons we are part of the Great Commission Collective and why we get so fired up not only for our church but also for all of the churches who seek to fulfill the mission of Christ.

11 How do you feel about being part of a church that makes disciples *and* multiplies churches?

EMBRACE

In the next session we will look at how we are to mature and grow as disciples of Christ. But before we close, take time to write down some highlights and goals from this session.

ENGAGE

Living things grow. And growing things need nourishment and care. As true as this is for our physical lives, it is equally true for our spiritual lives as well. Food, rest, mental stimulation, purposeful activity, and healthy relational interaction are each crucial for our personal growth. In this session, we will discuss how the food of God's Word, resting in Christ, renewing our minds with God's Word, spiritual disciplines, and a healthy church community all help us grow in our spiritual relationship with God.

Small group is a place where all of the above elements of growth can be experienced in an intentional way. To date, we are thrilled that the majority of the people you meet at Mission Church are in a small group.

- 1 From what you learned at Consider Mission, why might a small group be a great place to grow and mature in your spiritual walk?
- 2 What excitement or reservations do you have towards joining a small group?

EXPLORE

Our spiritual life and growth is a work of Jesus. After His death, burial, and resurrection, Jesus said He would send His Holy Spirit as a helper to teach, guide, and strengthen us. In this lesson, we will look at all Jesus gave and all the Holy Spirit uses to nourish and care for us as we mature and grow.

Jesus Gave Us His Own Example for Growth

LUKE 2:40

⁴⁰ And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favor of God was upon him.

Jesus came to earth as completely God and completely Man. It's hard to believe, isn't it, that God came as a baby and grew in all of the same ways that you and I grow?

1 How does this truth encourage you in your growth?

Jesus Gave Us the Bible for Growth

HEBREWS 5:12-14

¹² For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food, ¹³ for everyone who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, since he is a child. ¹⁴ But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil.

Hebrews 5 states that we need to be taught the basic principles of God so that we can grow from children needing milk to mature believers who can enjoy the more solid food of God's Word.

2 What is the benefit of learning the basic principles of God, such as distinguishing right from wrong?

Verse 14 says that the mature believer is one who has grown to discern good and evil through the discipline of constant practice.

- 3 How does knowing that maturity is a matter of discernment and practice affect your approach to spiritual growth?
- 4 What role does small group and discipleship classes play in your growth?

Jesus Gave Us Spiritual Disciplines for Growth

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1 TIMOTHY 4:7-8

⁷ Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; ⁸ for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come.

As helpful as bodily exercise and discipline can be, this passage makes it clear that spiritual discipline is of much greater value. Specifically, verse 7 says to discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness. The Bible teaches that the regular pursuit of spiritual disciplines allows us to experience the love of God and grow in godliness.

PRAYER

Prayer is simply talking to God. The Scriptures call us to do so without ceasing, which means that we have constant access to God. (*1 Thessalonians 5:17*)

BIBLE READING, STUDY, AND MEMORIZATION

We've already discussed the importance of the Bible. Simple reading plans, study methods, and memorization plans can be very helpful. (*2 Timothy 2:15, Psalms 119:11*)

FASTING

Fasting is refraining from a desired fulfillment, such as food, to focus on God. (*Matthew 6:16-18*)

SERVING

Using your spiritual gift to serve the Lord will help you grow. (*1 Peter 4:10*)

GENEROSITY

Giving your time, talent, and treasure back to the Lord. (*Romans 12:13*)

SINGING

Expressing your affection and adoration to God through song. (*Colossians 3:16, Ephesians 5:19*)

Jesus Gave Us Our Church Community for Growth

HEBREWS 10:24-25

²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works,
²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

The author of Hebrews was encouraging believers about how important meeting together as a church really is. It's so important that he says don't stop doing it!

- 7 These verses talk about the encouragement we receive and give at church. How have you been encouraged in your spiritual growth at Mission Church?
- 8 How can you encourage others as you gather regularly?

ENGAGE

In the last two sessions, we learned about the Church, our mission, and how our personal growth impacts that mission. Now, we turn our attention to what it means to participate in the mission through serving. Here at Mission Church, we believe everyone was created by God and all believers were given a gift for serving, which means we strive for everyone to experience the sense of belonging that finding a place to serve provides. There is a place for *you* here at Mission Church!

To date, over 80% of people at Mission Church are contributing in a significant role of service.

EXPLORE

Simply put, we strive to serve because Jesus served. In this way service is a privilege. To apply this further, we believe the “greater” the role or responsibility the greater the need for humility in our service. This conviction becomes incredibly clear when you consider Jesus’ own words. This lesson will present three ways the Lord prepares us for service. Take a look for yourself.

Jesus Sets the Example of Service

MARK 10:45

⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

JOHN 13:16

¹⁶ Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him.

It's truly humbling when we come to realize that Jesus came not to be served but to serve, even to the point of death.

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- 1 Describe the attributes and attitudes of a disciple who lives to serve Jesus.
- 2 How does Jesus’ example prepare us for service?

As servants of Christ, we should never desire to hold a standing greater than Christ's.

3 What are some actions we can take to demonstrate humility while serving?

Jesus Enlists Leaders to Equip us for Service

EPHESIANS 4:11-16

¹¹ And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

The pastors and elders of Mission Church are passionate about fulfilling their calling of equipping the saints. So you can expect that they will equip us in the following ways:

- Keeping us focused on vision and the expansion of the mission.
- Modeling how to discern right from wrong and confront sin.
- Training us to understand the gospel and how to share it with others.
- Equipping us by caring for, guiding, and protecting us, like a shepherd.
- Teaching us to grow in our knowledge of God’s Word and to apply it to our lives.

Jesus Entrusts Us All with a Spiritual Gift for Service

1 PETER 4:10

¹⁰ As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace:

ROMANS 12:3-8

³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.

⁴ For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶ Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; ⁷ if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸ the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

First Peter 4:10 says God has given us a gift to serve each other as good stewards of God's grace.

7 Describe what it means to be a steward.

8 Describe what it looks like to steward grace.

The Romans passage reminds us that we all have different gifts that motivate us in our serving. Take a look at the following chart that explains the gifts and then discuss which gift is your predominant motivation.

Don't be obnoxious or opinionated

Helping others see the truth clearly

Dear God, give me the sensitivity to show love, while sharing the truth that may offend.

Don't become weary in well-doing

Knowing you make a difference doing what no one else may want to do

Dear God, thank You for appreciating my labor of love, regardless of what others may fail to appreciate.

Don't neglect other responsibilities

Knowing people learn the truth

Dear God, help me to be practical, not just impart truth.

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Choose words wisely

Seeing people respond to your advice and helping them through problems

Dear God, use me to say what You would have me to say, not just what I feel at the moment.

Don't use money to control others

Knowing you contributed to the advancement of ministry without any personal recognition

Dear God, use my success with finances to bless the ministry and others.

Avoid thinking everyone will get involved

Seeing people work together to accomplish difficult tasks

Dear God, help me to be tolerant to those who don't respond like I think they should.

Don't be manipulated

Knowing you helped those who no one else would help

Dear God, use me to help people by not only showing care but also sharing truth and tough love.

As disciples, we are called to serve Jesus by participating in the fulfillment of the mission. That is sharing the gospel, gathering together to be strengthened, and multiplying the church. This of course takes all of us working together both at church and during our everyday lives.


EMBRACE

ENGAGE

We're here today because of gospel multiplication. For centuries the church has expended itself for the mission of making disciples and multiplying churches. Mission Church desires to be that kind of church. Our prayer is that the Lord will enable us to be generous in helping individuals and families, impacting our communities, serving and multiplying churches, and taking the gospel to the corners of the earth. We know that this is an ambitious vision, but we would not be called Mission Church if we didn't believe the Lord had called us to this work for His glory.

Whether this vision fires you up or intimidates you, please know that you are welcome here.

1 Realizing that we are all at different places in our faith, how do you feel about being part of a church that seeks to multiply the mission with intensity and intentionality?

EXPLORE

The Bible has a lot to say about generosity and multiplication. The Bible teaches that the Lord entrusts us with resources like time, talents, and treasures to be applied and multiplied for His glory. In this lesson we will learn what Jesus and the Bible teaches about multiplication and generosity.

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Jesus Taught That Multiplication is a Matter of Faithfulness

MATTHEW 25:14-30

¹⁴ “For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property. ¹⁵ To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. ¹⁶ He who had received the five talents went at once and traded with them, and he made five talents more. ¹⁷ So also he who had the two talents made two talents more. ¹⁸ But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. ¹⁹ Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. ²⁰ And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, ‘Master, you delivered to me five talents; here, I have made five talents more.’ ²¹ His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.’ ²² And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, ‘Master, you delivered to me two talents; here, I have made two talents more.’ ²³ His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy

of your master.’²⁴ He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, ‘Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed,²⁵ so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.’²⁶ But his master answered him, ‘You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed?’²⁷ Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest.²⁸ So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents.²⁹ For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away.³⁰ And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.’

The servants in this passage were stewards of the master’s resources. Understanding that the master represents God and the servants represent us in this passage, describe the attributes of a faithful steward that pleases God.

1 In other words, compare the attitude and actions of the first two servants with the third.

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A talent is a measurement (weight) of currency. For example, one talent of silver is roughly 75 pounds and would have been worth around 20 years’ wages for a common laborer.

2 How does realizing a talent is a lot of money change the way you view this parable?

3 Considering Jesus says they were faithful over a little, how great is the reward of heaven going to be for those to whom Jesus says, "Enter into the joy of your master?"

The unfaithful servant blamed the master, saying that he was hard, unengaged, and fearsome.

4 How can a loving relationship with God change our perspective of stewardship and multiplication?

Faithfulness Leads to Freedom

MALACHI 3:8-10

⁸ Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions. ⁹ You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you. ¹⁰ Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need.

This verse is a very popular Old Testament passage that is addressing the fact that God's people were not giving tithes and contributions to God. During the time of the Mosaic Law, these gifts were required to resource the temple, its festivals, and the priests and to help the needy.

- 5 What does the term “robbing God” reveal about the people’s hearts?
- 6 When God says “*test me in this,*” what does His promise reveal about His heart?

While the church today is no longer bound to the ceremonial commands of the Mosaic Law, tithing still serves as an honorable faith principle and goal. Abraham and Jacob (*Genesis 14:19–20, 28:20–22*) tithed prior to the Law, and today the mission of God is still going forward on the generous gifts of God’s people.

- 7 Addressing giving and generosity can be a touchy subject, but why do you think it is important to pop the bubble and talk about it in a membership class?
- 8 How does viewing the tithe as a timeless principle and goal help you in your processing of generosity? How can this lead to greater faithfulness and freedom at the same time?

Freedom Leads to Fruitfulness

2 CORINTHIANS 9:6-8

⁶ The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work.

These verses are the clearest instructions to the church about generosity and multiplication. The passage says...

- We reap what we sow.
- We each decide in our heart.
- We give cheerfully.
- We receive God's grace and care.
- We must abound in every good work.

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9 How do these instructions lead to greater fruitfulness?
What good works excite you most?

10 Have you sensed a spirit of generosity and joy in your time
at Mission Church? If so, please explain.

Fruitfulness Leads to a Strong Future

2 TIMOTHY 2:1-2

¹You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, ² and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also.

Of all the things that we can generously multiply, the greatest is ourselves. We want you to know that the greatest treasure in every church is the people.

11 How does this statement resonate with you? Why is it important for us to keep it front and center in our thinking?

This final point ties all the points together. From mission to maturity to ministry to generous multiplication, all that we do comes back to people being loved and sent to the glory of God.

12 As we embrace this truth, what can we do to intentionally pass it on?

13 How does what we've learned in these lessons ensure that these truths are passed on for generations?


